Lower Meal Costs Amid Rising Travel Expenses


Thanksgiving is a time for family, gratitude, and indulging in a classic meal that brings everyone together. However, the costs associated with this cherished holiday can vary widely depending on location, travel, and national trends. Here's an in-depth look at the numbers shaping Thanksgiving this year:

Thanksgiving Meal Costs: West Region vs. National Averages

The cost of a traditional Thanksgiving meal in the **West** is among the highest in the nation, totalling **\$67.05**, though it reflects a **6% decrease from last year's \$71.37**. This decline aligns with broader national trends, though the West's prices remain **15% higher than the national average of \$58.05**.¹

For context, here's how the national average cost of a Thanksgiving dinner has shifted over the past seven years:

Turkey prices, a key driver of overall meal costs, have dropped significantly, from **\$27.35 in 2023** to **\$25.67 in 2024**, offering some financial relief to hosts.

Nationally, the cost of Thanksgiving staples has seen fluctuations. Key highlights include:

- Turkey: Down to \$25.67, compared to \$28.96 in 2022.
- Pumpkin Pie Mix Now \$4.15, a modest decrease from \$4.44 last year.
- Rolls: Increased to \$4.16, up from \$3.84 in 2023.
- **Sweat Potatoes:** A significant drop to \$2.93 from \$3.97 in 2023.

Overall, the average cost of a Thanksgiving meal in the U.S. continues to stabilize after sharp increases in 2022, reflecting broader economic trends.

Travel Trends and Costs for Oregonians

Thanksgiving travel is a major factor for holiday spending. **California and Washington, D.C.**,² remain the most popular destinations for Oregonians, with the top cities including:

- San Francisco
- San Diego
- Sacramento
- Los Angeles
- Washington, D.C.

The **average travel cost** to these destinations has increased slightly, rising from **\$222.22 in 2023** to **\$232.08 in 2024**, based on second-to-fourth quarter price adjustments.

Gas Prices: A Mixed Bag for Travelers

Fuel costs play a critical role in travel budgets. In Oregon, gas prices as of November 25th have seen a significant year-over-year decline, dropping from **\$4.058 per gallon in 2023** to **\$3.546 in 2024**. While this offers some relief, Oregon's prices still exceed the **national average of \$3.06 per gallon**.³
